- SUPERINTENDENT WEAVER SHOWS THE BOARD SOME NATIONAL NUMBERS REGARDING CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM. NUMBERS HAVE GOTTEN A LITTLE BETTER EVERY YEAR SINCE COVID. HOWEVER, IT IS STILL AN ISSUE WE ARE WORKING TO FIX. SHE THEN SHARES SOME RESEARCH THAT SHOWS THE MAIN REASONS FOR ABSENCE, AND POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS. A 4-PRONGED APPROACH IS RECOMMENDED - FAMILY PRACTICES, SOCIAL CAPITAL, SCHOOLS, AND COMMUNITY SERVICES. PRINCIPAL SCHUYLER EXPLAINS A FEW STRATEGIES THAT THE MIDDLE SCHOOL HAS IMPLEMENTED TO INCREASE ATTENDANCE.
- Members discuss possible solutions and different ways we can equip teachers to promote consistent attendance. There are many factors that play into chronic absence including covid. Members share similar experiences in each of their fields and brainstorm possible factors that add to the problem. They discuss the correlation between extracurricular activities and attendance. Many of the upcoming projects are directly related to giving students more opportunity for buy-in. They discussed the school's partnership with northrange and the new counselor/social worker positions in the school.
